He is the Foreign Affairs Columnist for *The Indian Express*, New Delhi and Visiting Professor at the S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore. His columns also appear in the *Oriental Morning Post* (Shanghai). Previously, Dr. Mohan was Professor of South Asian Studies at Jawaharlal Nehru University in New Delhi. He also served as the Strategic Affairs Editor

of *The Indian Express*, and the Diplomatic Editor and Washington Correspondent of *The Hindu*. Dr. Mohan was a member of India's National Security Advisory Board from 1998-2000 and 2004-06, and led the Indian Chapter of the Pugwash Conferences on Science and World Affairs from 1999-2006. His recent books include *Crossing the Rubicon: The Shaping of India's New Foreign Policy* (New York: Palgrave, 2004), *Impossible Allies: Nuclear India, United States and the Global Order* (New Delhi: India Research Press, 2006), and *Power Realignment in Asia: China, India and the United States* (SAGE Publications, 2009), co-edited with Alyssa Ayres. Dr. Mohan has a master's degree in Nuclear Physics and a Ph.D. in international relations.
