

### **Program overview**

The Master of Public Administration (MPA) in International Impact Evaluation, offered through the Fels Institute of Government at the University of Pennsylvania in collaboration with the Penn Development Research Initiative/DevLab@Penn, prepares students for careers at international development agencies, evaluation and research organizations, nongovernmental organizations, and applied data analysis roles. Through coursework and experiential learning, students learn to mathematically and statistically analyze economic development issues, design rigorous impact evaluations, collect survey and administrative data, practically manage projects in developing contexts, statistically analyze evaluation results, and effectively visualize and present these results.
