Ek Tara comprises two distinct spaces: the Ek Tara Learning Centre and the Ek Tara Community Centre. The former is a safe and nurturing learning environment equipped with well-resourced classrooms, digital teaching tools, and an integrated Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Maths (STEAM) Laboratory. It also houses the Tomorrowland Foundation Music and Arts School. ELC reaches out to 1200 children daily and also looks into their health, hygiene and nutritional requirements as well. The latter focuses on programming geared towards the economic empowerment and social mobility of women, running vocational training and income generation initiatives, and creating resources to further Ek Tara's mission.
