Jana Urban Foundation



The CASI-Jana Urban Foundation partnership offers a competitive volunteer internship to current Penn students who are eager to work in India and take a hands-on approach to key issues in social and economic development. An internship with Jana Urban Foundation will enable Penn undergraduates and graduate students to meaningfully contribute to urban development efforts across India. Guided by a social objective while embracing market principles, the Jana Foundation serves poor families in urban regions as well as the larger segment that has difficulty accessing financial services. The foundation aims to make a difference through its suite of financial products, including credit savings, and insurance for the needs of customers. Students with an interest in finance, public policy, consulting, and urban development are encouraged to apply.

Internship Details

- 10 week internship from May 16, 2016 July 25, 2016
- CASI will provide up to three (3) Penn students approximately \$3,000 each to cover travel to and within India, affordable housing, and living expenses
- Funds are made possible through the support of Penn's Office of the Vice Provost for Global Initiatives and in conjunction with Penn Abroad and Penn's International Internship Program (IIP)

Potential CASI Projects

- Analyze and write reports based on household data collection and financial behavior to provide customized financial advice to customers (data, analysis, report writing)
- Conduct a study on local enterprises in the areas surrounding Jana Pragati Centres to understand existing strategic inputs, business processes, and identify areas for improvement (data, analysis, report writing)
- Develop surveys and evaluations to assess employee engagement and organization culture at Janalakshmi Financial Services (human behavior, psychology, communications)

Accomodation and Food

Penn students will stay at either a hostel or homestay near the Jana Foundation.
